Cape Town

Situated just to the west of the southern tip of the African continent. A good place to start you South African journey.

Dominated by Table Mountain which can be obscured by mist and cloud so see it when you can! A cable-car takes you to the top where there is a national park with spectacular views of Cape Town, Robben Island, Signal Hill and extensive walks along the flat top.

Castle of Good Hope (built 1679), Some lovely 4 and 5 star hotels, Victoria and Alfred Waterfront (shopping malls, arts, crafts cafes, restaurants).

Cape of Good Hope. Cape Point National Park, where you can see zebra, baboons, ostrich etc., and of course have your photo taken.

Boulder National Park for penguins.

Rainfall highest in their Winter (our Summer)

Durban.

Fly to Durban for access to Kwa-Zulu Natal and the battlefields and the Drakensburg Mountains. Game reserves include Lullui (shushlui) which reaches the coast so you can see both water and land based wildlife.

Rainfall least in our Summer (their Winter).

## Garden Route.

Cape Town to Port Elizabeth. Takes you along the south coast from West to East. All the delights of Cape Town, drive through the vineyards, mountains and lush valleys, Maybe visit Sanboona and catch a glimpse of white-lions! Continue of route 62 to the Lake District, Shamwari Game reserve is the next stop and is near Port Elizabeth. Malaria-free game reserves!

Kruger National Park, Cape Town and the winelands. Kruger is one of the best safari destinations in the world. Catch a glimpse of the big 5. Fly to Cape Town and see the city and the winelands (1 hours drive from Capetown).

Rail, wildlife and beach. Fly to Cape Town, then take the Blue Train from Cape Town to Pretoria (27 hour pure luxury), go on safari in the Kruger National Park, then fly to Mauritius for the spectacular beaches.

Things to be aware of:

Petrol stations only accept cash, not cards.

Check with your doctor to see if you will need anti-malarials

No visa required for UK Citizens for up to 90 days in country, but passport must have 6 months run on.

Timezone is 1 hour ahead of us therefore no jetlag.

Big Five: Lion, African elephant, Buffalo, leopard, rhinoceros.

Marine Big Five: Great white shark, Southern right whale, dolphin, penguin, seal.

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
